From reclaiming lost rivers to issues of sustainable urbanity, Professor Jong Sang Sung and Professor Durganand Balsavar, discuss the various factors that impact these seemingly disparate cities, exploring differences and common threads.

Professor Jong Sang Sung is a Professor at the prestigious Seoul National University in Korea, and currently serves as President of The Institute of Ecological Architecture and Environment (KIEAE).

Professor Durganand Balsavar is the Principal Architect-Founder of Artes-Human Settlements Research Collaborative. He is on the Advisory Board and Design Chair at Vellore Institute of Technology and is a nominated member on the Chennai Metropolitan Development Authority (CMDA) Masterplan of Chennai.
