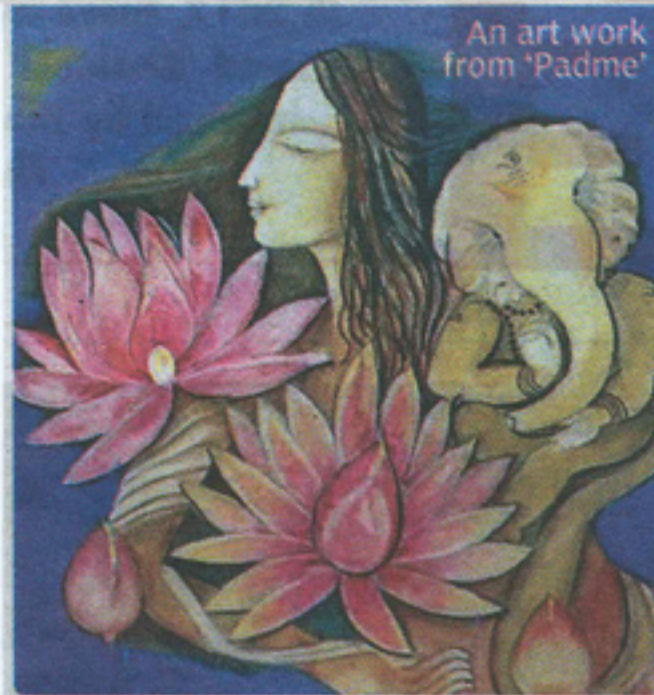

Contemporary and traditional art get a showing at the Chennai Chamber Biennale

IF you've always wanted to experience Korean art but didn't know where to begin, heading to the Lalit Kala Akademi this weekend may be a good idea. The Chennai Chamber Biennale, a bi-annual art exhibition of contemporary and traditional work by some of Korea's best-known artists and a selection of extremely-talented school children, will be open for the city's art lovers. With the choicest artworks from over 120 artists, curated over the last year by K-Art (an association promoting international exchange) headed our way, InKo Centre's director, Rathi Jafer, tells us the experience has moved to a whole new level. "It is the single largest exposition of Korean paintings in India. There is no single theme, but it is an opportunity to display the manner in which both senior and emerging artists have drawn from various sources of inspiration," she says. From contemporary to intricate Korean styles of work, a whole body of art from a nation far removed from our shores will be on display. To make the experience more interactive, 10 artists from Korea will visit the city to interact with local artists, arts organisations and visitors at the exhibition. They will also visit places of historic interest in and around Chennai. "The account of their visits as well as a special video that will be made during the course of the Biennale will be broadcast in Korea following the event," adds Jafer.

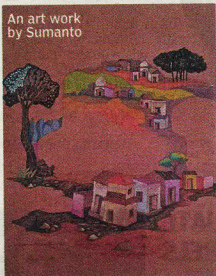
